Artists Announced for Joshua Tree National Park Art Exposition 2016

Forty-nine artists have been selected for the honor of displaying their artwork in the juried exhibition for the fourth annual Joshua Tree National Park Art Exposition in September in Twentynine Palms, CA.

On Friday, July 29, a selection committee met and juried 236 artwork images submitted by 92 artists from across California, the U.S., and British Columbia. The jury selected 49 artists and art pieces depicting or inspired by Joshua Tree National Park for this year's show. Artwork ranged from oil and acrylic paintings, watercolors, mixed media, and photography, to ceramic, glass, and metal sculpture.

Eleven out-of-state artists were selected for the exhibition: Naomi Brown, Queen Creek, Arizona; Laurel Cohen, Bloomington, Indiana; Robert Donsker, North Oaks, Minnesota; Frani Evedon, Colden, New York; Robert Fogel, Haughton, Louisiana; Nikki Gardner, Williamsburg, Massachusetts; Dale O'Dell, Prescott, Arizona; Larry Percy, Troy, Alabama; Rael Slick, Tucson, Arizona; Chrisanthy Vargo, Lantana, Florida; and Kim Zarney of Cleveland, Ohio.

Artists in the Joshua Tree Gateway Communities include Joshua Tree artists Doug Dolde, Frederick Fulmer, James Hammons, Jessie Keylon, Noreen Lawlor, Lenne Rosen-Kabe, Karine Swenson, and John Van Vliet.

Twentynine Palms artists selected are Penelope Benson-Wright and Chuck Caplinger.

Yucca Valley artists in this year's exhibition are Christina Cody, Janis Commentz, Bill Dahl, Tami Roleff, Laurie Schafer, Esther Shaw, Heather Sprague, Krista Wargo, Echo Westover, and Andy Willinger.

Artists from the Coachella Valley are Adam Labuen of Palm Springs, Robert Miramontes of Desert Hot Springs, and Martha Villegas-Valentin of Cathedral City.

One piece of art from each of the 49 artists will be displayed in the juried exhibition at the historic 29 Palms Art Gallery from Sept. 2 to Oct. 2. An awards reception will be held at the gallery on Saturday, Sept. 17, from 5 to 8 p.m.

Art Exposition weekend events will take place on Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 17 & 18, and will include an Art Market with artist booths, music, food and beverages on the lawn at 29 Palms Inn; free art classes and the exhibition at 29 Palms Art Gallery; art demonstrations at 29 Palms Creative Center; nature walks and talks at the Oasis of Mara and Joshua Tree National Park Oasis Visitor Center; and other activities throughout the weekend. All events are open to the public and admission free.
